focus -- teaching the writing process with a one-sentence composition

Wednesday, June 6, 2018

During this workshop, you will learn how to teach the writing process and the vocabulary of writing in six anchor lessons that include modeling, guided practice, and anchor charts.

- 1) Plan a first draft
- 2) Develop the draft
- 3) Revise the draft
- 4) Edit the draft
- 5) Publish

These anchor lessons lay a foundation for writing instruction and easily blend into any writing program.

The small writings contain structural components found in all writing. The thinking habits, craft moves, and editing learned when writing small will lift the level of all student writing and bridge all genre.

- BaDa... Sentences

- Pitchforking
- Ape the Authors

These strategies can easily be incorporated into any writing program.

They also can be used for writing in core subjects, i.e., science, math, social studies.
